

STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

DAVIESS COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Primary Direct Services

1. **Assessment**—identification of mental health and / or substance abuse issues that negatively affect the academic, personal and / or social functioning of the student. Threat assessments are obtained by first contacting Damon Fleming.
2. **Individual**—an individual session with an identified student for the purpose of ongoing assessment of and / or intervention for mental health issues.
3. **Family**—a family session with the identified student and one or more family members for the purpose of intervention for mental health issues.
4. **Group**—a group session with two (2) or more identified students for the purpose of intervention for mental health issues.
5. **Observation**—a professional observation of an identified student (usually in a classroom or other school setting) for assessment purposes or to provide follow up data for an previously established intervention.
6. **Conference**—a professional meeting with a combination of various school personnel, parents, student, etc. for the purpose of providing input regarding interventions, placements, IEP's, follow-up, behavioral and academic strategies, information gathering, etc.
7. **School Consultation**—a professional consultation with school personnel (teachers, principals, guidance counselors, etc) related to identified students and / or school wide mental health issues.
8. **Parent Consultation**—a professional consultation with parents of an identified student regarding mental health issues.
9. **Community Consultation**—a professional consultation with community programs, services, providers, etc. pertaining to the mental health issues of an identified student or some aspect of the school system.
10. **Emergency**—provision of assessment, intervention or consultation regarding mental health issues during a crisis situation.

Other Services

1. Provide assistance in development, maintenance and delivery of suicide prevention, threat assessment, mental health assessment and other school based mental health interventions.
2. Provide educational resources to students, parents, and school personnel regarding mental health issues.
3. Develop and maintain community liaisons with mental health providers with expertise in a variety of interventions and access to multiple levels of care. Develop and maintain liaisons with other community resources that provide assistance to individuals and families.
4. Promote wellness and prevention issues related to mental health issues.
5. Provide follow up and re-entry services for students who have received outside mental health services.
6. Participation in school safety teams.
