



# Dual Credit

The Dual Credit program is available to students in grades 11-12 who have the opportunity to take a variety of college courses at Owensboro Community and Technical College in place of traditional high school courses. Selections include Animal Science, English 101, English 102, College Algebra, Physics, Public Speaking and Sociology. Your high school College and Career Readiness Coach can provide information about specific courses and registration.

- Students earning qualifying ACT scores may take these courses at their high school to earn college credit. Eligible students must also be on track for high school graduation and demonstrate a strong work ethic.
- Students participating in Dual Credit courses will be treated as college students. It is important to know that they are ready for rigorous college work, which includes meeting mandatory deadlines. Students will be considered for participation in the Dual Credit program based on these additional areas of criteria:
  - ◆ Grade point average
  - ◆ Attendance
  - ◆ Maturity
  - ◆ Ability to multitask
  - ◆ Self-starter
  - ◆ Independent thinker
- In general, off-campus Dual Credit courses report grades by semester. Grades are not reported weekly in Infinite Campus.
- Dual Credit course grades are recorded on both high school and college transcripts.
- Tuition is offered at the Dual Credit rate.
- Scholarships are available.
